

We began council last evening 17 May at 5 pm. With 3 items covered. At 6:30 public council began with 2 presentations. Cape Sharp Tidal was first and gave a great update on the current project and future

plans including the second turbine installation later this year. They are currently looking to reopen their office in Parrsboro. Please drop by.

The second presentation was from Justin Harrison from Canadian International Ice Hockey Development Agency, a local Cumberland business wanting to expand world-wide and bring hockey players to our area for training. A win-win situation

for us. I am sure we will hear more on this!

We next approved a development agreement for new public road and multi-use dwellings in Parrsboro. This was followed by three dangerous and unsightly premises. All approved for demolition. The Springhill infrastructure tender was not approved as the tenders all came in way over budget.

Next we approved the tax exemption and reduction bylaw, followed by first reading of the Pugwash Secondary Land Use Bylaw regarding: Drive thru's. Motion carried. A letter of support for the Parrsboro and Area Harbour Commission funding application was approved.

The audit committee

terms of reference were moved to next council. We approved the kilometrage and transportation allowance rate change effective April 1 2017. A short discussion followed on the Maccan ballfield regarding condition and safety concerns. Local councilor and staff will discuss further. A discussion followed on procurement practices looking for cost savings. Staff will report back to council.

Next we approved membership for the Pugwash Source Water Protection Advisory Committee. Motion carried.

A short discussion followed on the Maccan Tidal Bore Park regarding mainte-

nance, lawn care etc. Staff and local councilor will investigate to find a solution. Info items in our package were registration costs for youth sports, conflict of interest, the Cumberland connector update, tax collection report, dangerous and unsightly update, and canine control/bylaw report.

Next council will be June 14 due to participation in FCM by some councilors. Question: have you decided who you are voting for? Call your councilor by Don Fletcher.


Tables can be rented at a cost of \$10 each. If you would like to rent one, please call Patricia Burke at 902-254-3839 or e-mail
