NOVA SCOTIA ELECTION



Questions to Jamie Baillie

To ensure residents in the former Town of Parrsboro and surrounding area do not have to leave the constituency, what would you do to ensure government services are more readily available in the immediate area?

I have constituency office hours in Springhill, Parrsboro, Oxford and River Hibert to help make sure residents have access to services locally. Residents in rural communities deserve the same access to services that residents in Halifax receive. I will continue to work with communities to ensure government services are more readily accessible for residents. **What will you do to ensure the ecology and environmental assets of the Bay of Fundy is protected and the livelihood of local fishermen is not impacted negatively?**

We believe the success of Nova Scotia's fisheries and aquaculture industries are critical for the overall growth of the provincial economy. We concur with the Ivany Report that supporting creative and innovative approaches in these traditional industries should be a priority. A Progressive Conservative government will encourage environmentally safe, economically sustainable growth in the industry. We will cut red tape for the lobster industry by scrapping the mandatory course for lobster processors. We will expedite the process to maximize Nova Scotia's aquaculture potential in a safe, responsible and

sustainable way, investing in new aquaculture methods and industries, while supporting traditional fisheries. **If you are elected what will you do to assist local initiatives to raise the profile of the Bay of Fundy so it becomes more iconic as a destination for tourists including more accommodations, food outlets and related services?**

We know a healthy environment can be a big boost for our tourism industry. We will develop an Eco-Tourism Task Force to develop new and innovative ways to showcase our beautiful environment, while supporting local tourism.

As the elected MLA for Cumberland South would you author a monthly column in the South Cumberland News to communicate with local residents?

Yes. **What will you do to raise the standard of living of Cumberland South residents so less of them are living on or below the poverty line?**

A PC government will make life more affordable by raising the Basic Personal Amount by up to \$3,000 for people with incomes below \$75,000. This will help over 500,000 Nova Scotians struggling under Stephen McNeil's high taxes. We also oppose Stephen McNeil's Carbon Tax scheme that will have a regressive impact on the poorest Nova Scotians by drastically raising the cost of energy and transportation. Instead of raising energy bills, a PC government will support the use of more natural gas, which will lower the cost of living for all Nova Scotians. Nova

Scotians need a break. High taxes, high power rates, and ever-increasing prices make it impossible for too many hardworking families to get ahead. Under a Progressive Conservative government, there will be no tolls on our roads and highways

What programs will you help implement to stop "out migration" resulting in youth and young families being attracted to live, work and play in Cumberland South?

We want families and young people to stay in rural Nova Scotia and put down roots. To do that, they need good jobs, safe roads and infrastructure and access to quality healthcare and education. The Rebuild Nova Scotia Fund will grow the economy and create jobs by investing \$2 billion on roads, bridges and other public infrastructure. These important investments will be made while anchoring the province's debt-to-GDP ratio at its current level. The Progressive Conservatives will continue to balance the provincial budget. Another industry I would like to point out is our film industry. I think there's huge potential there for Cumberland County. Our landscape is breathtaking. The film industry is internationally-recognized and is responsible for increasing tourism, fostering cultural pride and generating jobs in rural communities. A PC government will invest \$34 million in a refundable, Nova Scotia film tax credit. Nova Scotian productions, including newer and smaller filmmakers, will be given more opportunities and access to funding. We will also make the process move at the speed of business.

Realtors are having difficulty selling rural properties if high speed internet is not available. At the same time, the competitiveness of businesses and education of students is being hampered. It is common knowledge Bell Aliant has existing FIBRE OP along Highway #2 to Parrsboro and along Hwy 209 to Port Greville. What will you do to apply pressure forcing Bell Aliant to permit other

internet providers to tap into the existing infrastructure at an economical rate?

A Progressive Conservative government will connect Nova Scotians to world-wide markets with province-wide high-speed internet. Rural Nova Scotians were promised access to high-speed internet more than a decade ago. Too many families and businesses are still waiting. For them, it takes hours out of their day to update their business' website, research a school project or download a movie. As part of our Rebuild Nova Scotia Fund, a PC government will invest \$150 million, including federal and municipal cost sharing, over 10 years to bring high-speed internet service to Nova Scotians. **Can the lack of high speed internet in rural areas be solved within eighteen months?**

Fixing high speed internet in rural areas is a priority for the PC Party. As Premier, I will start work immediately to address the challenges and connect Nova Scotians to high-speed internet.

In your own words, why are you the most qualified candidate to represent residents of Cumberland South?

I have had the honour of representing Cumberland South for seven years. I have heard from many of you. I listened and I understand your priorities. Nova Scotians are tired of governments with no vision, and that only focus on cuts. They are tired of paying more and making do with less. Nova Scotia is better than that. We can do better. We have an optimistic, pro-growth agenda that focuses on rebuilding our province, creating jobs and getting Nova Scotians back to work. Some of our commitments include recruiting more doctors and investing in mental healthcare, building an education system that helps kids reach their potential, treating seniors with the respect they deserve and fixing our crumbling roads. Our plan is ambitious. There is a lot of work to do. I am confident that Nova Scotians can get the job done. It's time to think big. Together, we can do this. I believe in Nova Scotia's promise because I believe in Nova Scotians.
