Biggest Little Party In Atlantic Canada to Celebrate 32ND Year

Thousands of partygoers are gearing up for this years' 32nd Annual Oktoberfest in Tatamagouche, Nova Scotia September 23rd & 24th. Hosted by the North Shore Bavarian Society, this Oktoberfest is the largest in Atlantic Canada. Each year, over 3,000 people attend this German tradition which is celebrated all over the world.

Oktoberfest is a sixteen-day festival held each year in Munich, Germany during late September, early October. It is one of the most famous events in Germany and the world's largest fair, with some six million people who attend every year. Visitors to the annual event come from all over the world to take part in great German cuisine, beer-drinking, and lots music and dancing.

The North Shore Recreation Centre in Tatamagouche is transformed into a colorful Bavarian-style Dance Hall each year to celebrate this event. Partygoers should prepare to polka, because two top-notch German bands, The Saxons & The Variations from Kitchener, Ontario are the featured 2011

performers playing at all three events. The Centre will host an evening dance Friday, September 243rd, and an afternoon Beer Garden and an evening dance Saturday, September 24th. The town also gets involved by decorating the village with banners, streamers, mannequins, cornstalks, and more. Church Suppers, Breakfasts and Quilt Sales are a few other activities planned in the community.

Multiple beverage counters feature domestic and German beers, local wines, imported spirits and a popular Schnapps Bar, as well as soft drinks and coffee. Concession booths offer Canadian and German cuisine, including sausages, schnitzel, international cuisine and cheesecake. Items like beer steins, t-shirts, sweatshirts, hats, pins and other novelty items are available as Oktoberfest souvenirs.

Authentic German music, food and beverages and plenty of dancing makes this event the 'best little party in Atlantic Canada.' Ticket prices range from \$15 - \$20 for each event and are available through Ticket Atlantic on line or
