It may have been the last breakfast ever, because the church has been listed with a realtor and is up for sale. Also on Saturday, the community centre hosted the last version of the 2013 summer bazaar.

There are no Friday Night Suppers at the Debert Legion in September. At press time, it is not known if suppers will continue this fall. So far no one has come forward to champion the cause this year.

An urgent public meeting was held on Monday, August 26 at 7 pm in the Debert Fire Hall (after this issue was being printed), to discuss the Debert After School Program. 2013 'Not Since Moses' Run - Huge Success

With a great deal of mud, muck and motivation participants in the 7th Annual "Not Since Moses Walk/Run" headed out across the floor of the Bay of Fundy on August 11th.

The weather was perfect, with gentle sea breezes keep-

ing the temperatures and humidity at perfect levels for athletes giving their all to finish the gruelling 5 or 10km course. Footwear seemed the only major casualties of the event, certainly not the place to wear your best running shoes.

There were many first timers on the course including Angela Ward, of Debert, who says she had a blast. "The whole event was very well organized. It was definitely hard but awesome!" Two families from the Stewiacke area, the Nielsen's and Harrison's

were using words like "amazing" and "fabulous" to describe their first Moses run.

The event's founder Dick Lemon was very pleased with the success of the run and couldn't help but smile as he looked down at hundreds of runners coming across the finish line. "We started with 182 entries and the event has gotten bigger and bigger each year. We had 1202 last year and 1610 this year," says Lemon. "This year's event was probably the most complex event we have ever had it, and it was run the smoothest of them all."

This is Lemon's last year as organizer of Not Since Moses. He is passing the reins to Rob Chambers, of Halifax Trail Runners and Harold Corbett, of Five Islands and feels very confident in their ability to keep the event going. "I hope to be actually running in the event next year," he laughs.
