and soon, procedural credentialing. With that new oversight, some duplication has occurred in the health-care system. "Doctors Nova Scotia has been urging both the NSHA and the College to work together on issues such as licensing, privileging and performance reviews," said Dr. Milne.

Charges of theft of cocaine, trafficking in cocaine, breach of trust, and laundering proceeds of crime have been laid against Staff Sergeant Craig Robert Burnett, a member of the RCMP working at the RCMP Operational Communications Centre (OCC), located in Truro. In September 2015 SiRT was contacted by the RCMP in relation to information they received which alleged in 2011, a member of the RCMP had stolen a 10 kg quantity of cocaine from an exhibit locker and replaced the drugs with another substance.

A request for proposals for master planning and programming for all QEII's clinical services was issued Thursday, Aug. 4. This includes the selection of a multi-disciplinary team to work with government and Nova Scotia Health Authority to develop a facility and functional plan for the Halifax Infirmity expansion and renovation, the enhancement of the Nova Scotia Cancer Care Centre, and the development of new community and specialized outpatient centres. Deadline for submissions was Aug. 26. It is expected to take up to a year to develop a plan and program. Once complete, the province will engage a design consultant team to develop architectural designs.

Karen Hudson has been appointed deputy minister of Justice. She was executive director of Nova Scotia Legal Aid. Ms. Hudson's appointment is effective August 8.


