

# Rolling Barrage Visits Bass River

Cpl Scott Casey (ret'd), Kamloops, BC, is president of Military Minds Inc and is on a mission which will take him and supporting members across Canada within 15 days during 2017 for several reasons.

Casey and many of his supporting members are volunteering their time to raise awareness of Military Minds Inc. 2017 initiative to tour Canada under the banner of "Rolling Barrage - (TRB)".

The Rolling Barrage started the cross-Canada tour in St John's, NF on August 5th with 8 motorcyclists.

They will arrive in Kamloops on August 18th and complete the journey in Victoria on August 20. When it left Truro on the morning of August 7th for Veterans Memorial Park in Bass River the tour has grown to 59 riders.

The core riders are from BC and are accompanying Cpl Casey on the cross-Canada venture. However, many Nova Scotia enthusiasts several from the Annapolis Valley and Truro were accompanying the group on its tour to Parrsboro, then to Aulac, NB.

When they entered NB they were being met by several other biker-supporters who were riding along to Oromocto for an even at the Legion later that evening. Casey anticipated the pick-up at Aulac would be approximately 100, so that when they arrived in Oromocto, the number would have risen to approximately 150.

The Rolling Barrage is a rolling fundraiser presented by Military Minds Inc, in support of veterans and serving members as a show of strength, and unity to conquer the stigma of combat ptsd. It is anticipated as the bar-

rage moves across Canada, riders in each province will join-in for a couple of days.

By the time the TRB bikes dip their wheels in the Pacific Ocean, they will have enjoyed the support of thousands of supporters across Canada.

Although plans are always evolving, Casey anticipates the movement will grow so there are numerous weekend events in each of the provinces on a yearly basis, and then have a Cross-Canada ride every five years. On the fifth year, the executive would work with the various provincial chapters/groups to schedule provincial weekend rides in accordance when the national ride would be in each of the areas.

During the interview he said "This fundraiser is more than just about raising money. Although it is our primary goal, so that we may launch and maintain programs under the MMI banner, it also encourages veterans, serving CAF members and first responders to get together and confirm our sheepdog society. Brotherhood is significant in any heal-

Minds Inc is that unique organization, wanting to be the largest, trusted hub that connects veterans.

The Military Minds website states, "We have our spokes prioritized from the input of our member focus groups and now we have to fill in the connecting points of the spokes by finding out the best paths for our members and helping them get to where they need to go based on their individual needs".

In talking with Cpl Casey in Bass River, he was insistent, "All funds raised from our sales go directly into a trust account and are accessed only to assist with veterans needs".

When a similar chapter "Ride to the Wall" was started in USA, the first ride from California to Washington involved a few hundred bikers. Now a few years later, there were over 700,000 motorcycles participating.
