

RCMP Seek Public Assistance

Cumberland County District RCMP, on August 16th, issued an appeal for public assistance for help to identify an ATV driver involved in two incidents. On July 24 at approximately 1:40 p.m., RCMP members saw a three-wheeler ATV on Lagoon Rd. in Springhill. When police attempted to stop the vehicle, it fled the scene.

On August 13 at approxi-

mately 7:45 p.m., the RCMP saw someone suspected to be the same driver on the same ATV. The vehicle headed down the middle of Black River Rd. toward McGee St. It did not stop at the stop sign and crossed McGee St., driving north on Athol Rd.

When RCMP members attempted to stop the vehicle by activating emergency police equipment, the ATV driver failed to stop and sped past the police vehicle. Operating an ATV in this manner is dangerous and illegal.
