## “Rolling Barrage 2017” Riders Visit Ottawa House

The “barrage” was a troop of 66 riders on motorcycles including a small dog named “Molly”, as part of a cross-country trip to raise awareness of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Veterans, serving military members, law enforcement officers, first Responders, and folks that support them all, were part of the inaugural Rolling Barrage 2017, a cross-country motorcycle ride that started August 5 in St. Johns Nfld and rolling West to Victoria B.C.

They pulled in to Ottawa House By-the Sea Museum in Parrsboro on August 7th for a mid-morning break and refreshments.

The trip was organized by the non-profit group “Military Minds”, which provides peer

support to those of their members suffering with PTSD.

Mark Rutherford, one of the riders, said “The stop at The Ottawa House by the Sea was amazing! The warm welcome, delicious refreshments, the scenic beauty of the place will long be remembered.” Ottawa House curator/manager Susan Clarke said she was impressed at the number who came and how interested they were in the museum.

The group will be picking up and dropping off riders as the trip unfolds, but some of those at Ottawa House told Curator Manager Susan Clarke they plan to make the entire trip and dip their toes in the Pacific Ocean.
