\$30,000 for 4-H Barn Recommended

Colchester County 4-H Council is breathing much easier, thanks to the co-operation and support of Colchester Council. During the presentation meeting on August 7th, Lisa Patten representation the 4-H council requested Council follow through on previous commitments to provide \$100,000 funding towards improvements to the 4-H barn located on the NSPE grounds.

The funding request, made during the 2018/19 budgeting progress, went off the rails when council was not comfortable with a certain clause in 99-year lease with the province, which indicated the province could ask 4-H vacate the premises within a certain amount of days. Further discussions with the province revealed the particular clause is included in all leases with

community groups. This was confirmed Mayor Blair had with provincial officials.

The province has also made a similar financial commitment to Colchester County 4-H, which includes 300 54-H members, one of the largest memberships in the province. The 4-H barn was built with community and council participation years ago, but has fallen in dis-repair over the years.

Recent improvements, thanks to sponsorship, in-kind material and labour donations have enabled the 4-H council to achieve more than was anticipated in the first year. These improvements include: 9 new doors, 6 of which are oversized garage style doors; drainage around the building and the outside arena; two additions have been erected on the sides of the building;

plumbing has included new wash area and water supply to the additions; new steel siding for exterior walls and roof and new railings and sand for the outdoor arena.

Patton's presentation to council on August 7th indicated there was a sense of urgency to her appeal, because new lighting was required prior to 4-H activities on August 22nd as part of Nova Scotia Provincial Exhibition. When the new doors were installed electrical services were disconnected and a new entrance panel was needed prior to restoring electrical service.

4-H is currently seeking funding from Efficiency Nova Scotia as well as Community Facility Improvement Program for security fencing and Community ACCESS-ability Program for barrier-free washrooms. After the rush is

there was an urgency need of an immediate injection of \$30,000 to complete the work by August 22nd.

At council's committee meeting on August 9th, council re-addressed a \$100,000 commitment over four years. After discussion, Councillor Stewart's made a motion to

provide \$30,000, immediately and consider remainder after all details and paperwork were completed.

Council committee approved recommending to council's monthly meeting on August 30th \$30,000 in interim financing.
