Solid Water By-law Passes Second Reading

A revised Solid Waste By-law passed second reading at a special council meeting on August 9th. Additional items for the special meeting were approval of minutes from previous meetings and first reading of a new Kennel Development By-law. Coverage of the Kennel by-law is included in separate story elsewhere in this issue.

Purpose of the revisions to Solid Waste By-law were listed as: For Council to consider amendments to the Chapter 33-Solid Waste By-law, by way of Second Reading, to permit the use of only blue transparent bags for recyclables; to add a clause which would allow leaf and yard waste for curbside collection as permitted by Council Policy; and, to allow persons to remove designated materials as identified by Council Policy from time to time for recovery or reuse.

Primary changes to the by-law include Blue Bags Vs Clear bags; Paper Bag Leaf & Yard Waste Collection and Curbside salvaging. Details of the rationale and analysis for each category is as follows:

Blue Bags vs Clear Bags:

With all materials set out on the same day for collection, it can be difficult for the collector to determine which bags contain recyclables and which contain garbage as some garbage looks very clean and some recyclables are very dirty.

Collectors could have 2,100 stops per collection day averaging over 500 per collection ve-

hicle. For efficiency purposes, the pickers move quickly to get their route completed.

Daylight hours, weather (snow, high winds, heavy rain, etc.) can affect the pickers ability to correctly determine which bags are recyclable and which are garbage.

Analysis:

The Materials Recovery Facility processed 9,000 metric tonnes of recyclable materials in 2016/17 and approximately 14% or 1,300 metric tonnes of this material was garbage.

The curbside contractor collects over 2,000 metric tonnes of recyclables per year from the residents of Colchester County. Thus, 280 metric tonnes of these materials are estimated to have been garbage.

Some of the most common challenges are bags containing bathroom, medical, and kitchen waste.

Blue bags can be more expensive than clear bag - retailers pricing for blue bags ranged from \$0.17 to \$0.29 with clear bags ranging from \$0.12 to \$0.19 in similar sizes.

Paper Bag Leaf & Yard Waste Collection

Many residents gather leaf and yard waste that exceeds the capacity of their green cart.

Since the roll out of green carts, there has been no official collection of any additional leaf and yard waste. Residents are expected to eventually feed the excess material through their green cart or haul the materials
