## Woman Charged Following Threats

Cumberland County RCMP with assistance of the Amherst Police Department have arrested and charged a 22-year-old woman from Collingwood following an investigation into threats. On July 30, police searched a home in Collingwood and arrested Candace Morgan Lydia Haines. During the arrest, an RCMP car sustained minor damage. Police seized several electronic devices as a result of the search.

Haines has been charged with Uttering Threats Against People (three counts), Uttering Threats Against Property, Mischief, Breach of Probation and Fail to Comply with an Undertaking. Haines was remanded into custody and appeared in Amherst Provincial Court on July 31. She is scheduled to appear in Dartmouth Provincial Court on August 20. The investigation is ongoing.

- place to ensure equipment is operating properly and in good condition and that windows can be opened
- masks and hand sanitizers are starting to arrive at schools. All students and staff will receive two free cloth masks. Disposable masks will also be available if a student forgets or loses their mask during the school day
- Regional centres for education and the Conseil scolaire acadien provincial, will continue to communicate with families. Principals will also reach out to families with specific information about their school closer to September
- before and after school programs will be offered in accordance with public health guidelines
- schools, with the support of public health,

will notify families as soon as they become aware of a COVID-19 case in their school, along with what measures will need to be taken.

- a return to school sport schedule and protocols that follow public health guidelines are in the final stage of development with Sports Nova Scotia and will be sent to schools by the Nova Scotia School Athletic Federation. The purpose of the proposed Local Improvement By-Law is to establish the way that the Municipality will charge and enforce payment of charges for local improvements such as water systems and sewer systems. The properties to be rated or charged will be determined on a project by project basis and be included in, or added to, Schedule "A" of the By-law.

The purpose of the proposed Public Sewer By-Law is to outline the operational aspects of the sewer systems (i.e. the connection and disconnection process), define the manner in which sewer charges are calculated and assigned, and set out the specifications for what is acceptable to discharge to a public sewer. These by-laws are intended to replace the current Local Improvement and Public Sewers By-Laws.
