## Once in a Lifetime Parachute Jump with the SkyHawks

It only took five seconds to answer the question posed by Atlantic Air Show Media & Public Relations Director Tracy Morgan-Boudreau, "Do you want to jump with the Sky Hawks?", but I will admit to having second thoughts a few hours later.

The Canadian Armed Forces Parachute Team, the SkyHawks were scheduled to perform in Air Show Atlantic, Debert on Saturday, Aug. 26th and 27th. A

few media personnel were to be invited to go on a jump with them on the Thursday, the 24th. I had checked the box on the registration form to say I would do the jump but never expected to get chosen. Now, in less than 24 hours, at 61 years of age, I was going to be jumping out of a plane.

The Canadian Armed Forces Parachute Team, the SkyHawks, are Canada's only military parachute demonstration team. The 15 demonstrators come from

the Canadian Army and the Canadian Rangers

Knowing I would be in good hands and googling the risks of skydiving (which said you had a higher risk of injury on the drive to the jump) made me put any reservations aside and show up on time for this once in a life-time experience.

The day was perfect for jumping out of a plane at 12,000 feet. A high ceiling, bright sunshine and little to no wind. There were three of us

## Replacing Deteriorating Sandbag Trench at VMP

On the 19 Aug 2023, the board representing The Veter-

ans Memorial Park executed a workday to replace our deteriorating sandbag trench. Community involvement was overwhelming with a total of 52 people showing up to do the hard work.

Designed and built over 15 years ago the Garden of Sorrow is one part of the Celtic Flower design of the park. The 1100 plus sandbags which line this 100-foot area is a sterile replica of the horrific trenches of WWI. It provides a unique opportunity for the visitors to experience the illusion of stepping down into a trench with upturned soldiers' helmets a stark reminder of the sacrifices.

In 2022, the sub-committee started the plan to replace our concrete filled burlap sandbags as the mixture was crumbling. Through planning and the calling of friends, colleagues, and community members the first Casey Concrete truck showed up at 8AM and the second was emptied by 1PM the over 50 volunteers (listed below as best we could recall) had 19 cubic meters of cement filled and placed. It truly was a show of camaraderie, community, respect, and teamwork. Especially reassuring to see so many young people participate.

## Kiltober September 30<sup>th</sup>

The Debert and Area Community Association requested and received a grant of \$6,000 from Colchester Council at its committee meeting on August 17th after its return from July break. The funds will be used to fund 2023 Kiltober being held on Ventura Drive in Debert on September 30th. Opening ceremonies will be held at 12 noon, although Scottish Heavy Events start at 9 am.

Events will include the Ancient Scottish heavy events from 9am-5pm; BBQ and sweet treats beginning at 11 am. Other attractions will include live music provided by Five Days in May from 3-7 pm; Pumpkins for Distance and the 2nd annual pie eating contest.

Kids activities will include: Bouncy Tent; face painting, petting zoo crafts starting at 11 am.

Free admission to the events, except for concessions, which will operate on a "cash only" basis. To assist Debert and Area Community Association undertake additional community events, throughout the year, cash donations at the gate are welcomed and appreciated. The association hopes to host Kiltober on an annual basis.

This funding request falls under the municipality's Community Event Policy of which \$60,000 was included in the 2023/24 maintenance budget for Community Event Grants. Currently, \$9,510 of the \$60,000 has been committed to community event activities to date.
