## RCMP Seizes Drugs, Firearms, Tobacco and Stolen ATVs

Cumberland County District RCMP seized substantial amounts of drugs, firearms, illegal tobacco and stolen ATVs during the searches in Birchwood and Hansford. On July 31, Cumberland County District RCMP executed search warrants at homes in Birchwood and Hansford.

At the property in Hansford, officers located and seized more than 1,500 Methamphetamine tablets, 150 Oxycodone tablets, approximately a kilogram of crystal meth, 40 firearms, illegal tobacco and six stolen all-terrain vehicles. At the search site in Birchwood, officers located and seized a stolen utility trailer.

Of the eight people arrested, five were later released without charges.

A 39-year-old man, wanted for being at large without excuse for parole violations, was turned over to a correctional facility. A 31-year-old Hansford woman was later released on conditions and is scheduled to appear in Amherst Provincial Court on September 30, 2024.

Steven Matthew Wilson, 39, has been charged with: Possession of Property Obtained by Crime; Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose; Unauthorized Possession of a Firearm; Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (three counts); Unlawful Possession of Tobacco Products and Possession of a Firearm Contrary to Order

Wilson appeared in

Amherst Provincial Court and was remanded into custody. He returned to court on August 6, 2024

A ninth person, Stephen Joseph Maloney, 33, also known as Dakota, is believed to have been at the Hansford residence prior to officer's arrival. He remains at large and wanted on a province-wide arrest warrant. The investigation remains ongoing with the assistance of the RCMP's National Weapons Enforcement Support Team (NWEST). Additional criminal charges are anticipated.

## Moving Toward Cleaner Fuels

The Province is now taking applications for the Clean Fuels Fund, which helps industries, businesses and communities switch to low-carbon and renewable fuels.

"We're moving toward a cleaner, greener Nova Scotia, and our industries are making the move with us," said Tory Rushton, Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables. "The Clean Fuels Fund will help us transition from fossil fuels, getting us closer to our net-zero target by 2050."

The fund helps replace traditional fuels with cleaner fuels for heating, transportation and industrial processes. Options include biofuels and biomass from forestry waste products, green hydrogen and renewable natural gas.

\$3 million is available for eligible projects in 2024-25; recipients can get 75 per cent of project costs covered if their costs are \$500,000 or less; 50 per cent if their costs are more than \$500,000; the fund started in 2023-24 with \$3 million for seven ready-to-launch projects in a quick-start stream and the clean Fuels Fund advances action 60 under Our Climate, Our Future: Nova Scotia's Climate Change Plan for Clean Growth.
