Our community recently had our bi-annual election in February of this year. Congratulations and welcome to all new and re-elected council members.

Economic Development
Millbrook's commitment to economic development, fueling opportunities for its community members, and creating more prosperity in Colchester County.

NS Native Women's Association Resiliency Centre: Grand opening will be in September.
Construction of new Apartment building in Cole Harbour.
Partnership with Lindsay Construction.

Legends Ave Commercial Development: will result in 28,000 sq. ft. of additional leasable space. Current tenants in the completed buildings include: The Confederacy of Mainland Mi'kmaq offices, Farm Credit Canada, and renowned artist, Alan Syliboy Art Studio - which just celebrated the first anniversary of the art studio location.

Addition to Reserve Process: 1200+ acres, mixed-use commercial and residential.

Tufts Cove: 27.19-acre community on Dartmouth side of Halifax Waterfront.

Housing
Rapid Housing Initiative 3 (RHI 3): In January 2024, Millbrook announced a partnership with CMHC to produce a 34-unit housing development for Millbrook residents. This was in response to the increasing need for safe/available, and affordable housing for our members.

RBC On-Reserve Housing Loan Program: This program has provided opportunities for members wanting to build their own homes on reserve. MFN guarantees a loan from \$50,000 to a maximum of \$250,000 to purchase, renovate, construct or repair a single-family dwelling. 4 members have completed homes.

New Housing & Public Works Office: Now located at 60 Treaty Connector Rd.

Millbrook Fisheries
Lobster Pound: Opened in April 2024 in Sheet Harbour
Lobster sold commercially/wholesale and able to be bought by the public, directly from fishers.

The facility holds 53,000 pounds of live lobster for up to 5-6 months.

The facility includes a pump house, holding/purging tanks for live products, and a state-of-the-art, open-loop system that brings seawater into the tanks.

The Open-Loop systems use a source of fresh (sea) water to flush ammonia and waste from the system, which can be deadly to the species being held.

Parks and Recreation
Community Garden High-lights:

Over 60 homes are involved in "Growing Millbrook at Home." This initiative is designed to improve individuals' gardening skills to aid in food security efforts in the home. Participants are provided with raised garden beds at home.

In 2023, Millbrook developed community gardens, improving food security in our community while also introducing Millbrook residents

and youth to the agricultural process of growing their own food and traditional medicines. We added 14 raised garden beds to our existing community garden this year.

8-pointed star garden bed for traditional medicines.

There are more improvements planned for the community garden, including a Greenhouse renovation which is underway.

Goal: Donate 4,000 lbs. of food to the community.

Parks & Greenspaces
We will be constructing a Splash Pad in Millbrook this year. This will be an open-access recreation space that everyone can use.

Truro residents are encouraged to explore our trails, such as the Wood Chip Trail and John B trail.

Education
It is graduation season; I want to take a moment to acknowledge our graduation.

We have 24 high school graduates from Millbrook, many of whom are graduating from Cobequid Educational Centre.

7 Post-Secondary Graduates this year.
Banners for graduates will be hung along street poles this summer to celebrate them.

We are proud of their work and the work of Millbrook's Education Department.

Millbrook Market
The Millbrook Market is a vibrant community initiative designed to support local Mi'kmaq artisans and promote their handmade crafts.

This is an economic opportunity for small vendors.

Market is held Monthly, with plans to increase frequency, and to increase patronage.

Over 30 registered vendors sell authentic Mi'kmaq crafts, artwork and other items.

The next market is on June 29 in the Power centre

Water Infrastructure Funding for Oxford

New water systems will provide reliable water supply and enhance fire protection in Oxford, Cumberland County. The replacement of water mains and residential water service lines will address ongoing leaks and provide more reliable supply for residential use and fire protection for Foundry Street.

"Oxford is a wonderful place to live and work, with lots to look forward to on the horizon," said Tory Rushton, Minister of Natural Resources and Renewables and MLA for Cumberland South, on behalf of John Lohr, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing. "It's crucial that we provide residents and business owners the infrastructure they need to continue to grow and thrive."

The Province will invest nearly \$1.04 million in the project, with an additional \$1.12 million coming from the Town of Oxford and other sources.
