Bill was a strong believer in volunteerism and served on a number of boards over the years including the Central Nova Tourism Association (Chair), Nova Scotia Tourism Partnership, the Bay of Fundy Tourism Partnership, Central Nova Industry Education Council, Colchester Regional Development Agency known as CORDA (Chair), KFC National Advertising Board, Tourism Association of NS (TIANS), Perennia and the Colchester Regional Hospital Foundation (Chair).

Bill was recognized over the years for his business achievements and his commu-
