valuable timber products and providing habitat for countless non-human beings. This event showcases that healthy forests are integral to the well-being of our communities.

Mary Jane Rodger, Executive Director of the Medway Community Forest remarks that,

“The Forest Market is a one-of-a-kind event and is part of a larger MCFC mandate to promote the diversity of values that forests offer. Since day 1, a key goal of ours has been to support rural communities – along with forest stewardship on our land base, the forest market is one way we can showcase the diverse revenue streams supported by forest-based entrepreneurship.”

On Sunday August 23 the Forest Market will welcome craftspeople, artists, and organizations that celebrate forests through their work. The Market will boast woodturners, Ash-basket weavers, furniture makers, spoon-carvers, illustrators and textile artists. Participants will be invited to interact with live demonstrations of basket weaving, heritage hand-tool carpentry, live oil painting and enjoy some live music.

A raffle draw will take place at the end of the market with a prize basket consisting of artisanal wood products, vouchers for the Medway Community Forest Campground, and contributions from local businesses. The Market will begin at 10:00AM with a proclamation from the Annapolis Royal Town Crier, and forest-themed celebratory cake will be shared

around noon. Participants are invited to browse handmade goods, connect with local organizations, and celebrate our culture rooted in the Wabanaki Forest landscape.

Matt Miller, Operations Manager for the Medway Community Forest remarks that “The Forest Market is a small but mighty effort in advocating for rural resiliency. It’s an event that showcases forests as a priceless resource for our economic, cultural and social well-being.”
